HIGH PLAINS PROCESSING PROJECT MOVES FORWARD WITH STRONG PROGRESS THIS WINTER

Throughout January and February, steady progress was made on the construction of the High Plains Processing (HPP) oil extraction and refining project. Key advancements were made in construction efforts, keeping the project on track despite the winter season. The construction team made significant strides toward enclosing key structures and ensuring the continuation of piping and electrical installation work fronts. The grains area saw continued development on the bridgework and loadout building, with a significant milestone being the start of the precast structure taking shape, which completes the first phase of the shipping and receiving building. With engineering nearing completion, the project remains well-positioned for the subsequent stages of construction as we look toward springtime activities in the schedule.

Looking ahead, we plan to start the installation of our final grain storage bin, finalize all structures, and focus our efforts on the piping and electrical

As we prepare for a fall startup at our new High Plains Processing Plant, we're excited to share continued momentum in staffing and team development.
